ABSTRACT

George Town Heritage City has been inscribed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 2008. As part of a serial site with the Melaka Heritage City, George Town World Heritage Incorporated was established as a Site Manager by the State Government of Penang. This presentation details the challenges and limitations in the management of a Cultural Heritage Site under the 1972 Convention that consists of both tangible and intangible heritage in the Outstanding Universal Values. The lecturer will share GTWHI's strategies and opportunities to overcome the issues through synergizing resolution from the 2003 Convention.
